#### Some news from Charlotte Harkness

Charlotte is also training for formal ministry - here's an update from Charlotte

For the last couple of years I have been exploring the possibility of training in lay ministry, and what that might look like. This began when I was working alongside the Revd Sharon Connell, Head of Chaplaincy at St Nicholas Hospice Care. Sharon asked me if I'd considered the Diocesan Auxiliary Ordination Pathway (AOP) and I began to explore training in chaplaincy. From then, I joined a Fellowship of Vocation Group meeting at Abbey House in Bury St Edmunds. Following two selection panels, one local and one national, I have been commissioned and am now on the AOP. This pathway is flexible and is designed for local self-supporting parish ministry. A group of us meets fortnightly with Bishop Martin for bible study, reflection, communion and mutual support, and we also take a range of modules related to local ministry. This flexibility suits my work and family commitments and it means that I am able to take my time on this journey as I continue through the discernment process.

(Just in case you are worried because Bishop Martin is leaving us in March 2025 for a well-earned retirement, please note that Bishop Graeme Knowles has been confirmed by Lambeth Palace to be the Acting Diocesan Bishop from 1 March. He was formerly Bishop of Sodor and Man and then Dean of St Paul's, and retired to Bury in 2012. He has been serving as the chair of our DAC (a diocesan advisory group), and so knows much about the current life of the Diocese. Also Bishop Tim Stevens, retired Bishop of Leicester and formerly Bishop of Dunwich, also living in Bury, is offering to provide additional episcopal care in the Diocese, including for our AOP and Deacons and Priests programmes, as well as for occasional Sunday and other services.

community that relies on support from each other and Holy Trinity has set a wonderful example of what Community really means.



# A Bible Verse from John Chapter 3


Jesus said: But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

#### CS Lewis Reflection - "Cellar Time"

C. S. Lewis said that for him, "Nothing was any good until it had been down in the cellar for a while."

In my last house, I was fortunate to have a cellar. Natural light was limited which meant at times if I spent too much time down there I began to feel more Hobbit than human. Yet it was not where I stored my wine but my study, my prayer space and, at times, my 'shouting at the world' place. It was where I met with God but equally where I sat alone feeling an abject failure and fraud.

I have struggled with advice that in reality really only points back to the person giving it. Hearing about their own ability to "climb the stairs" due to their many years of achievements can end up being quite discouraging.



A better relationship will come from others' "cellar experiences", the ones that share flaws, failures and faith crises. The ones that will act as a pathway to lead another into a place of peace, patience and a greater understanding of themselves and God.

In Luke's gospel the people "were amazed" at Jesus' teaching because his words carried authority (Lk 4:32). His authority held people's attention because it came with a deep understanding of his own sense of being and bearing. It allowed him to be heard and to empathise with others.

When we have spent time "in the cellar" we will offer self-confidence, grounding, and validation to those around us. You can only lead others as far as you have gone. This is what will mature us.
