#### **Assisted Dying**

This is a very sensitive topic which has been in the media recently in light of the Private Members Bill being introduced into parliament shortly. As the Archbishop has said: We want compassion offered to those in deep distress and we want our loved ones to be able to die with dignity (see here). Similarly, he points out the legitimate concerns about slippery slopes and safeguards, and personally I wonder whether the NHS has the capacity to manage this well and worry about our culture further losing its sense of the sanctity of life. Please firstly can you pray for anyone who finds this debate upsetting as they remember their loved ones. Please also pray for wisdom for our leaders. If you want to engage further please contact our MP James Cartlidge as there will be an open meeting on this topic.

#### **Closer to God?**

As Christians we are encouraged to get closer to God, but how exactly do we do that? We can go to church, where we will hear His Word, sing hymns in His praise, and take Holy Communion. Or we can read the Bible to get a deeper insight into Scripture, or perhaps say grace before our meals to acknowledge His generosity. We can walk in the countryside and admire His creation, or we can help others by giving to charity, volunteering, or supporting friends and family in times of trouble. We can even join fellowship groups to share ideas on how to be better Christians. And, of course, we can pray.

According to a nationwide poll of over 2,000 adults carried out in 2018 by the Tearfund, 51% of UK adults pray. Even among those who say they are not religious, 20% say that they pray especially during a crisis. This suggests that even in our secular society prayer is still important to us and, as many of us who pray regularly know, it is perhaps the most effective way of getting closer to God. Why? Because God answers our prayers. He may not answer them immediately, or exactly in the way we hoped, but time and again He leads us to the right solution, one that helps us on our journey through life and, ultimately, brings us closer to Him.

So how, and when, do we pray? Some of us may pray in church. Others may pray before they go to sleep at night. Some may only pray when they or someone close to them is in trouble. Or we may just sneak in a little prayer as we drive to work in the morning especially if we are stuck in traffic and worried that we'll be late! Yet if prayer really is so good at bringing us closer to God, perhaps we should be more adventurous in how and when we do it? If you would like to try a new way of praying why not join our weekly online Prayer Group? It is held on Zoom every Tuesday from 9 – 9.30 a.m., and thanks to the miracle of technology you can join us from anywhere in the world, even wearing your pyjamas!




#### Tea and Tiaras: new Stained Glass Conservation Fundraising event
