I am delighted to report that Revd Canon Malcolm Rogers is preaching at Holy Trinity on the morning of the 12th January at 10.30am, we will also have a less formal Q&A style session at Lawshall Church at 4.00pm on Sunday afternoon.

Malcolm was the Anglican Church's representative to Moscow when the Ukraine war broke out. Malcolm and his wife Alison have ministered in Russia for a number of years. If you want to learn more about life in Russia, and perhaps get some new perspectives on all that is happening, do come along to Lawshall.

Lord Have Mercy ...

At a time when we are still reeling from the consequences of the Makin report, I am trying come to terms with continuing media reports about the 1000's of young girls being raped and abused in many towns by organised gangs - apparently with the knowledge of the authorities. The scale and extent of the abuse is hard to comprehend. Firstly, we must pray for the victims; justice delayed is justice denied, and light must be shed on how this came to happen. We must also pray for wisdom on how to react - both for ourselves and for our leaders. Sadly there are many other contexts in which abuse also happens. What does God think when he looks down on our overly sexualised and perverted society? How have the virtues of purity and self-control become so distant, and how has such abusive behaviour seemingly become acceptable? So I pray ... Lord have mercy.

Hope!

Feeling down at the start of 2025? Depressed by the news. At the end of yourself perhaps? Last night in the small hours, in my prayers I reflected on Jesus on the cross - a place of death and desperation - and yet the cross and resurrection provide the promise of life, restoration and a better future to come. Something changed in my heart. We will be exploring the topic of hope more in the coming weeks, starting at our informal worship (Shine) on the 17th January at 4pm in the Lady Chapel at Holy Trinity. For the festival of the Baptism of Christ on the 12th January

Collect (prayer for the day)

Eternal Father, who at the baptism of Jesus didst reveal him to be thy Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit: grant that we, being born again by water and the Spirit, may be faithful to our calling as thine adopted children; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading

¹⁴ When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to Samaria. ¹⁵ When they arrived, they prayed for the new believers there that they might receive the Holy Spirit, ¹⁶ because the Holy Spirit had not yet come on any of them; they had simply been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. ¹⁷ Then Peter and John placed their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. *This is the word of the Lord Thanks be to God*

Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

¹⁵ The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. ¹⁶ John answered them all, 'I baptise you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire.'

²¹ When all the people were being baptised, Jesus was baptised too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened ²² and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: 'You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased.'

Almighty God, in Christ you make all things new: transform the poverty of our nature by the riches of your grace, and in the renewal of our lives make known your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**

First Reading

Now about the gifts of the Spirit, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. ² You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to dumb idols. ³ Therefore I want you to know that no one who is speaking by the Spirit of God says, 'Jesus be cursed,' and no one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit.

⁴ There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. ⁵ There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. ⁶ There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

⁷ Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. ⁸ To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, ¹⁰ to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

Gospel Reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, ² and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. ³ When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, 'They have no more wine.'

⁴ 'Woman, why do you involve me?' Jesus replied. 'My hour has not yet come.'

⁵ His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

⁶Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from eighty to a hundred and twenty litres.

⁷ Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water'; so they filled them to the brim.

⁸Then he told them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet.'

They did so, ⁹ and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realise where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside ¹⁰ and said, 'Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now.'

¹¹ What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
